- NDIS commences in the Fraser Coast, North & South **Burnett including Cherbourg** on 1 July 2018.
- NDIS commences in Toowoomba including Southern & Western Downs, Goondiwindi and Yarraman on 1 January 2017.
- A Continuity of Support Program has been developed for people aged 65 years and over, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples aged 50 and over, who are receiving specialist disability services but are not eligible for the NDIS.
- National Disability Service has also been discussing Continuity of Support arrangements for people who are employed in an Australian Disability Enterprise (ADE).

Safety Tips in home from Worksafe Qld

- Never overload a power point.
- Only use power boards with low power items like televisions, videos and stereos and not with high power items such as room heaters, clothes dryers and washing machines.



The National Disability Services "Australian Disability Enterprise Excellence Award 2016" was awarded to The Gumnut Place at the Disability at Work Conference in Canberra on 30 May. Gumnut Place was established in 1986 by family and friends of people living with a disability as a response to the need for local supported employment opportunities. Based in Murgon and part of South Burnett CTC Inc's Disability Services since 2007, Gumnut Place now provides meaningful work for 20 Supported Employees through five business streams including a wood workshop, commercial kitchen, commercial laundry, a trophy and engraving service and a secure document destruction service.

Each Supported Employee is supervised and mentored to work safely and productively at their own capacity and to transition into open employment if they have a goal to do so.
